


MEET THE OIL STAFF

Mike has been a board member of two Wheelchair Athletic Associations. He has represented the USA on several international wheelchair sports teams and won many medals and been presented awards throughout those years. Mike has extensive training in all areas of the Americans with Disabilities Act, Accessible Housing, Universal Design, Federal Disability Legislation, Fair Housing, and Disability Civil Rights Project, etc.

Mike has been a presenter at several regional and state conferences. His favorite topic areas are Disability Rights, Independent Living Philosophy, IL History, the ADA, Assistive Technology, Cross Disability Discrimination, Peer Counseling, Inclusion, and Recreation specific to people with disabilities.

FREE DENTAL CARE COMING SOON!

The Oklahoma Mission of Mercy (OkMOM) is a free, two-day dental clinic open to people of all ages and backgrounds. It is specifically designed for people that are uninsured, underinsured, or would otherwise not be able to seek dental care.

<u>Location:</u> S.E. Expo Center in McAlester

Dates: February 3rd & 4th

Starting: Doors will open at 5:00 a.m. each day

<u>Closing:</u> Doors will close each day when we reach capacity

What services will be available?

Our team of volunteer dentists will determine your treatment plan when you arrive. Your plan may include:

- Restorations (Fillings)
- Extractions
- Cleanings
- Root Canals (Anterior Only)

How Do I Qualify/Registration?

The first 1,000 people through the doors each day qualify. It's that easy.

- No Pre-registration
- No Prequalification
- No Payments or Insurance Required

What age groups can be treated?

All ages will be seen. However, we may be limited to the types of services offered if they are age-restrictive (Dentures will not be available at OkMOM).

If I am under 18, do I need a parent or guardian present?

Yes. A parent or guardian must stay with the child throughout treatment.

Is there anything which would disqualify me from treatment?

Each patient will undergo a simple medical exam at the start. Some things that could prevent you from being treated include:

- a. having a fever at the time of treatment
- b. uncontrollable, abnormally high blood pressure
- c. excessive bleeding in the past

How early should I arrive?

The doors will open at 5 a.m. Regardless of when you plan to arrive, please keep the following in mind:

- Patients will not be allowed in the building before 5 a.m.
- If you decide to stand in line, it will be very cold outside so DRESS APPROPRIATELY.
- Collapsible chairs, blankets and sleeping bags will be allowed. However, you may not have a chance to return them to your car and will need to carry them with you throughout the day.
- Tents will not be allowed. No exceptions.
- Security and restrooms/portable toilets will be available.

What time will the clinic close?

We will treat approximately 1,000 patients per day so once we reach our quota, we will close the doors to any new patients for that day. If 1,000 people are in line at 5 a.m., we will not open the doors for new patients that day. If 200 people are in line we will continue accepting patients until we reach our capacity.

Can someone come with me while I am being treated?

You are welcomed to bring a

friend or family member with you. They can stay with you while you are outside in line but we will require them to go to a family/friends waiting area as soon as you enter the building.

My entire family needs to be seen. Is that possible?

Yes. However, we will only allow one parent/guardian to go with children under 18.

Will breakfast/lunch be provided?

Yes. We will serve breakfast and lunch to all patients waiting on treatment.

Is there a limit as to how much treatment I can receive?

Due to limited supplies, time, and volunteers, we are limited to the amount of treatment we can provide. Our first priority will be to treat your critical dental needs. When you enter our clinic, one of our volunteer dentists will meet with you and determine your treatment plan.

What should I bring?

We recommend the following:

- List of current medications
- One day supply of medications
- Baby supplies for a full day (diapers, formula, etc.)
